

LUTONIAN LOST.

Came from Canada to Enlist.

Mr. and Mrs. Thos. Ed. Geo. Bodell, of Toronto, were crossing in the Lusitania with their only child, a boy of two years, and, as their names have not appeared in the list of survivors, their safety is now despaired of.

Mr. Bodell, who was 33 years of age, was the son of Mr. Thos. Bodell, of 59, Clarendon-road, Luton, and he sailed for Canada ten years ago last week-end. He was returning for the first time, and his father says it was his intention to enlist, he having realised upon his business of a brass and electrical fittings maker at Toronto.

He married a Welsh lady in Canada, and her brother at Cardiff spent the early part of this week at Queenstown trying to identify his sister, her husband and the child. Up to Tuesday, however, he had not been successful.

Mr. Bodell, jun., served his apprenticeship at Messrs. Hayward, Tyler and Co., of Crawley-road, and he afterwards worked in London. He used to be secretary of the Luton Amateur Football Club, and he was a scholar at Waller-street School.
